Leader: On the third Sunday of Advent we light the candle of joy. We read in Luke that Elizabeth's baby leaped with joy at the baby Jesus' presence. Jesus came to bring us all joy. He says we will have joy as we draw near to him and live as he modelled life for us. Happiness goes away, toys break, things in our lives don't always turn out as we had hoped, but God's presence is a constant source of joy.

"At that time Mary got ready and hurried to a town in the hill country of Judea, where she entered Zechariah's home and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. In a loud voice, she exclaimed:

"Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! But why am I so favored, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy." (Luke 1:39-44)

²⁶ One month later God sent the angel Gabriel to the town of Nazareth in Galilee with a message for a virgin named Mary. She was engaged to Joseph from the family of King David. ²⁸ The angel greeted Mary and said, "You are truly blessed! When Jesus was born in the village of Bethlehem in Judea, Herod was king. During this time some wise men from the east came to Jerusalem ² and said, "Where is the child born to be king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him."
